## SIGNATURE OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION

The SPACE AISBL (composed of <u>EUROSPACE</u>, <u>SME4SPACE</u>, <u>ESRE</u>, <u>EASTRO</u> and <u>EASN</u>) is thrilled to announce the signature of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the European Commission, officially establishing the Globally Competitive Space Systems Co-Programmed European Partnership.



The Globally Competitive Space Systems Co-Programmed European Partnership is officially launched after the signature of the Memorandum of Understanding by the European Commission and the SPACE AISBL on Tuesday, September 10th 2024 in Brussels (Belgium).






### **Background**

The Globally Competitive Space Systems Partnership is launched with up to 100 Millions € of EU Funding for R&I (to be leveraged through additional in-kind contributions by the partners to reach 220M€), and a short window of operations, targeting the calls 2025, 2026 and 2027 of the Horizon Europe Work Programme.

On March 2024, a **preliminary plan** for the Globally Competitive Space Systems Co-Programmed European Partnership was being released by the SPACE AISBL, proposing to focus until the end of Horizon Europe on cohesive activities in the domain of digital developments under the grand heading of **Digitalisation for Commercial Space solutions**:





### Next steps

The European space supply chain, under the lead of the SPACE AISBL, will now start to reflect on recommendations to apply the specific objectives of the Partnership to the Horizon Europe Work Programme of 2026 and 2027.
